- VIP entrance for school dance
- Local restaurant/movie certificates
- Lunch DJ student set the playlist during lunch
- 3-point competition against the Principal at a school rally
- · Pie a teacher Pie Day celebration
- All-sports pass
- 2 extra Graduation tickets
- Premium Parking top junior gets a reserved spot for the following year
- School gear
- Yearbook
- Dance tickets
- 5-Star Fridays reserved treats for students with 5 stars (top 10%)
- Homework Pass *talk to your teachers!*
- Mile Pass *talk to your coaches!*

How to Calculate

Use an "average" student as your starting sample. Assume they attend half of your events, participate in a few clubs, and are well behaved. See sample below.

All activites, 1 dance, 2 spirit days, 2 club events, 10 sporting events, 1 premium sport event, 45 behaviors, 1 no tardy, 2 tutoring sessions, 4 study halls

Things to Consider

- How often can a student redeem a reward (daily, weekly, monthly)?
- Are you going to deduct the points as they purchase prizes, or will you use a tiered system (i.e. Level 1 = 100 points. Level 2 = 350 points, etc.)?
- Are you going to carry their points over from year to year? The system resets their points automatically each year, you'll need to manually roll their points over.
- Activity points are included in their total for the entire year. Notice the points totals in both semesters.
